Ellalong Public School Anti-bullying Plan 2023

Bullying behaviour has three key features. It involves the intentional misuse of power in a relationship. It is ongoing and repeated, and it involves behaviours that can cause harm. The NSW Department of Education requires all NSW public schools to have an Anti-bullying Plan which details the strategies implemented to reduce student bullying behaviours.

Ellalong Public Schools's commitment

Our school rejects all forms of bullying behaviours, including online (or cyber) bullying by maintaining a commitment to providing a safe, inclusive and respectful learning community that promotes student wellbeing. Executive staff are committed to establishing evidence-based approaches and strategies that promote a positive climate where bullying is less likely to occur.

1. School culture and inclusion

All members of the school community are active participants in building a welcoming school culture that values diversity and fosters positive relationships. A key component of a supportive school culture is building respectful relationships and an ethos that bullying is not accepted, in both online and offline environments. School staff will actively respond to student bullying behaviour.

Our school engages in the following practices to promote a positive school culture.

1.1. Student assemblies

Student bullying and expectations about student behaviour will be discussed and information presented to promote a positive school culture where bullying is not accepted.

1.3. New and casual staff

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New and casual staff will be informed about our school's approaches and strategies to prevent and respond to student bullying behaviour in the following ways.

New and casual staff will be informed of Ellalong Public School's approaches and strategies to prevent and respond to student bullying behaviour when it does occur by-

- an executive staff member will induct to new and casual staff when they enter on duty at the school and provide school support strategies and key staff contacts

- the principal will oversee the induction of any new staff

-information will be provided in the casual information booklet that new casual staff receive when induction takes place

-posters on What is Bullying? are displayed in each room and new staff will be directed to these

2. Partnerships with families and community

Effective schools have high levels of parental and community involvement. This involvement is strongly related to improved student learning, attendance and behaviour. Our school proactively builds collaborative relationships with families and communities to create a shared understanding of how to support student learning, safety and wellbeing.

2.1. Website

Our school website has information to support families help their children to regulate their emotions and behaviour and develop socially. Information is provided to assist if children have been involved in bullying behaviour (as the person engaging in bullying behaviour, as the person being bullied or as the person witnessing the bullying behaviour).

3. Support for wellbeing and positive behaviours

Our school's practices support student wellbeing and positive behaviour approaches that align with our school community's needs.

Social and emotional skills related to personal safety, resilience, help-seeking and protective behaviours are explicitly taught across the curriculum in Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE).

Examples of other ways our school will embed student wellbeing and positive behaviour approaches and strategies in practices include the following.

Ellalong Public School has a whole school approach to our students wellbeing and positive behaviour. At Ellalong Public School we will participate in the National Day Against Bullying and Violence and undertake lessons and activities to increase students' knowledge and understanding of what bullying is.

We have weekly Peer Support lessons that cover various areas of student wellbeing. We also have weekly BounceBack! lessons in each class and these lessons follow the Bounceback! scope and sequence so all classes are undertaking the same topic at their level. We also have the Bounceback! Acronym displayed in all classrooms, library and on a wall in the playground. We follow the PBL principles and these are embedded into our whole school reward systems.

We will engage with the Police Community Liaison Officer and arrange them to come and speak with the students in Stage 3 about Cyberbullying and safe online behaviour.

The school will respond swiftly and seriously to negative behaviours to maintain a supportive learning environment.
